Formal Outline

- I. Thesis statement - Capulet and Montague and the family feud, Friar Lawrence, and Romeo & Juliet are responsible for their own deaths.
- II. Topic sentence - Capulet, Montague, and their whole family feud are contributing factors in the deaths of Romeo & Juliet.
 - a. Capulet tried to marry off Juliet too quickly, Lady Capulet convinced J. to marry.
 - i. "He shall not make me a joyful bride." (A. 3, S. 5, L. 118) Paris.
 - b. Capulets convinced the prince to banish Romeo.
 - i. "I beg for justice, which thou, Prince, must give; / Romeo slew Tybalt; Romeo must not live." (A. 3, S. 1, L. 179 & 180)
- *Transition sentence - Another person who could be held responsible is Friar Lawrence.
- III. Topic sentence - Friar Laurence can be much more to blame for the deaths of Romeo & Juliet than the Capulet/Montague family feud.
 - a. Married R + J in secret.
 - i. "Till Holy Church incorporate two in one." (A. 2, S. 6, L. 37)
 - b. Big plan was a big fail, no backup plan (Gave Juliet fake death potion)
 - i. "She will beshew me much that Romeo / Hath had no notice of these accidents," failed to deliver message to Romeo. (A. 5, S. 2, L. 26 & 27)
- *Transition sentence - But all in all, the main one you can point fingers at for the deaths of Romeo & Juliet is Romeo himself.
- IV. Topic sentence - Romeo could be the main firestarter of this whole misadventure of him and Juliet because he rushed into all his decisions and killed himself, Tybalt and Paris.
 - a. Rushed into all his decisions.
 - i. "My lips, two blushing pilgrims, ready stands / To smooth that rough touch with a tender kiss." (A. 1, S. 5, L. 95 & 96)
 - b. Killed himself, Tybalt and Paris.
 - i. "Thy drugs are quick. Thus with a kiss I die." (A. 5, S. 3, L. 120)
- *Concluding sentence - Therefore, Romeo can be the main person to blame for the deaths of him and Juliet.
- V. Conclusion - In conclusion, Capulet, Montague and the feud, Friar Lawrence and Romeo are to blame for the deaths of Romeo & Juliet.
